- 5) Guide gratuity is always appreciated. General service guidelines are 20%+ for a good trip.

+ make sure to bring the following items with you:

Rain jacket.

A warm layer like a puffy or sweatshirt.

Reusable water bottle! We do our best to kick plastic and never use single use bottles. Sunscreen and lip balm.

Polarized Sunglasses with Amber Lenses.

Summer months can have big hatches of mosquitos. Bring repellant.

A valid Oregon fishing license. Purchase at the shop or online at www.myodfw.com

We provide rods/reels/lines and flies and terminal tackle for our river trips.

If you wish to bring your own rod, a 8 1/2' to 9' three or four weight is perfect for these waters. Euro Nymph Rods are popular on our rivers and a 10' or 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ " 3 weight are recommended. Streamer fishing is done with a 5 or 6 weight rod.

Waders and Boots with studded soles are important.

Many clients also prefer to use a wading staff to navigate the currents and downed trees in this section of river.

We offer a rental wader and boot package for \$20. Please let the shop know your height/weight and shoe size and we will have them saved for you.

+ Flies and Hatches

June/July/August PMD, Green Drakes, Caddis, Golden Stones, attractor dries and Terrestrials. Rainbow Warrior, Walts Worms, Eggs, Perdigons, Micro Streamers, 2 Bit Hookers, Micro Mayfly, Zebra Midges. Sculpins, Leeches and Jig Streamers can be very effective in the early season. September PMD, Mahogany Dun, BWO, attractors and terrestrials. Split Case PMD, Rainbow Warrior, Eggs, Perdigons, Copper John, Micro Streamers, 2 Bit Hookers, Micro Mayfly, Zebra Midges.
